Bikewise



Today we went to Sydney Park to do something called Bikewise. Here we learnt all about bike safety. The first thing they did was test us to see which groups we would be put in. The name of the groups were A and B. There were 3 instructors: Bart, Dion and Lydia. They took the two groups and alternated between going round the park and learning theory in the classroom.

Each group rode all around the park and practised different drills. We learnt that you should always stay to the left whenever you're riding a bike because it gives room for the other people on the road. We also learnt that if you are ever trying to turn you should let the other cyclist go past first. We did things like practising what we would do if we would ever have to cross a driveway. During lunchtime and recess we got to play on the fabulous equipment at Sydney park and rest. Sometimes when we were riding we would all bump into each other and some people would fall off their bikes - but no one was hurt. We also practised skidding down a hill and stopping. At the end we got to have free-play and ride more freely.
