Premiers Debating

Every year the school competes in the Premiers Debating Challenge. Debating is one of the hardest things that you can ever do and many adults quiver at the idea of having to complete against each other. In the Premiers Debating Challenge, students have compete against other schools around a series of topic areas. After choosing from 3 topics, both teams go away and spend one hour preparing their debate. When they choose a topic they have to be sure they can argue for the topic (affirmative) and against the topic (negative). After an hour, they come together to debate in the presence of an audience and an adjudicator judges the debate. Debaters are expected to not only argue for their side but to challenge (rebut) the opposing team. It's hard work but its amazing seeing year 5 and 6 students doing it. Tomorrow (Monday 20 May), six year 5 and 6 students will be attending a workshop run by the NSW Arts Unit at Lewisham Public School. The workshop is a great opportunity to learn new skills and to consolidate knowledge. After that the school our debating team will be competing in four debates. We wish them all the best of luck.

Reading Workshop

This Week in Koalas - Year K

English

Reading: Students are continuing to make connections with the texts that they read through guided reading and modelled reading. We are also continuing to develop skills to become independent readers. Writing: We are continuing to write daily creating a variety of text types. Students will be focusing on finger spacing this week. Daily handwriting will continue to focus on correct letter formation. Grammar and punctuation: This week students are focusing on pronouns and identifying pronoun references. Spelling and phonics: This week we will finalise our unit on the phonemes v/w/y/z/j/n/k/e. We are planning to begin looking at the digraphs II/ss/ff/zz. Speaking and listening: Students will begin their public speaking journey. The class will investigate the purpose of public speaking and to introduce the PEEL strategy to assist them when speaking in public.

Mathematics

Number and algebra: This week we will continue working on addition and subtraction. Students have begun completing the daily 'Maths Challenge' to practise their ability to add and subtract daily. We will also complete a variety of games and activities to help develop their skills to add and subtract one and two digit numbers.

Statistics and Probability: Students will work on using yes/no questions gain data. We are also going to represent the data on simple graphs to be able to interpret the data they acquire.

Other KLAs

Science: Unfortunately last week we were unable to complete our planned experiment on proving that living things need energy so we will complete the experiment this week.

PDHPE: Students will discuss what is appropriate and inappropriate touching and how to seek help if you do not feel safe in these situations.

Creative Arts: Students will begin to brainstorm and work on our Inspire Art project for the children's hospital. We will also discuss the techniques we are going to use for our project.

This Week in Echidnas - Year K/1

English

Reading: Students will continue to make connections to texts in shared reading, learn about decoding strategies in guided reading and use these strategies independently. Writing: Students continue writing, for different purposes, every day. They will create a persuasive text related to living world in science. Correct pencil grip, letter formation and posture in daily handwriting continues. Grammar and Punctuation: Students will continue to learn how to use conjunctions and/but/so and how to record direct speech. Spelling and Phonics: Kindergarten will learn their term 2 sightwords (line 4, continue blending known phonemes into 3 and 4 letter words and start learning ll/ss/ff/zz. Year 1 continue learning o oa ow o_e with daily sightwords and spelling. Speaking and Listening: Students will continue to play games to develop speaking and listening skills and use a structure (PEEL) that supports Public Speaking.

Mathematics

Number and Algebra: In the daily maths challenge students will add or subtract single digit numerals from single and double digit numerals. Students will create or continue a repeating pattern using simple computer graphics and create, record and describe number patterns that increase or decrease. **Measurement and Geometry**: In three-dimensional space students will manipulate and describe an object hidden from view using everyday language. They will identify the type and number of flat and curved surfaces of three-dimensional objects students creating more objects from nets.

Other KLAs

Science: In 'Living World' students will learn about different types of scientists and the scientific skills needed and continuing study of external features of plants. Students will continue to observe and record changes to their seedlings.

PDHPE: Students will continue to learn about safety, respect and learning in Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L), in bathroom settings at school. In 'Healthy Eating' students will learn about 'everyday' and 'sometimes' foods and discuss healthy food solutions to various scenarios. Students will learn athletics skills at Got Game, and in class sport be involved in a variety of activities.

This Week in Korean

We will continue reading the story book and practise the sentence pattern learned last week. Two more Korean bush animals and edible plants will be introduced. We will play a matching game on the interactive whiteboard. Early finishers and Bilbies can read the sentences to practice the rhyming words in the story.

Echidnas

Wombats will appreciate a Korean porcelain, Goryeo celadon from 12th century. We will explore the patterns and colours commonly used and learn the meanings of these patterns. Wombats will design patterns on a porcelain template. The key words will

be porcelain, cranes, clouds

Year 3 Goannas will catch up with the lesson they missed due to NAPLAN last week. The rest of Goannas will complete the work they have started last week. Goannas will learn that the best month to grow lettuce would be March or September. The key words will be 'cool/hot, grow/cannot grow, March and September'.

Dingoes will learn what Australia sells/ exports to Korea. We will draw a graph or pie-chart using various data about the goods and services traded. The key words will be iron ore, coal, education, travel and beef.

This Week in Wombats Year 2

Reading and Comprehension: This week Wombats will be focusing on answering literal (here) and inferential (hidden) questions with an emphasis on checking in the text before answering.

Writing: In writing Wombats will be continuing with planning and writing an information report but this time on their own through a Big Talk and Big Write session.

Speaking & Listening: Wombats will be beginning the K-2 public speaking program and this week's topic is 'My favourite book is..'

Grammar & Punctuation: This week the class will be exploring contractions **Spelling and Phonics**: As part of our revision of previous units of work this week the target phoneme is /ie/. - ie igh y i_e i

Mathematics

English

Number & Algebra: Wombats will continue with addition and subtraction this week. They will be revising the jump strategy and learning how to use a simplified version of Newman's Analysis to help them solve maths word problems.

Statistics & Probability: Students will continue their unit on data. They will be collecting data using tally marks and form a picture graph from that.

Other KLAs

Science: This term the science topic is Living World. This week students will be learning about native and introduced species of plants. They will also be setting up a hands-on long term investigation.

Physical Education: Students will be focusing on athletic skills this term in GOT Game and then applying these skills to games in K-2 sport.

Visual Arts: Wombats will be exploring biomimicry as part of whole school INSPIRE! Art Project.

This Week in Goannas - Year 3/4

English Literacy groups will be continue this week with students rotating through reading group work, spelling, handwriting, grammar and editing activities over the week.

In **writing**, the Goannas will continue to look at the structure and features of persuasive texts. We will look a little further into persuasive devices then focus on paragraphing and building opinion.

Mathematics

Our focus this week will be addition and subtraction. The students will be looking at the addition and subtraction of two or more numbers, with and without trading, using the equals sign to record equivalent number sentences, solving addition and subtraction problems involving money and calculating change to the nearest five cents. Our daily mathematics challenge also continues with a focus on addition fluency.

Other KLAs

PDHPE: As part of the topic personal health choices the Goannas are doing a Drug Education unit This week the focus is on medicines and who gives them to us.

Science: Students will continue with their research on the life cycle of a living thing of their choice to present as a slide show.

History: Students are continuing their research on a local site to identify change and continuity of our local area.

The students will be solving problems using length and perimeter. They will also find the area of regular and irregular 2D shapes later on in the week

Science: The students will continue to use gathered data and research to create a Google site that explains the structural adaptations of the bee, physical conditions required for the plants in which the bees pollinate and survive, and how honey is produced.

PDHPE: The Dingoes will continue with their learning about Drug Education. This we we will investigate the rules for taking medicines.

Visual Arts: We will continue to work on our Inspire Art Project for the Sydney Children's hospital. The students have begun exploring biomimicry inspired artwork to appreciate and then later replicate.
