

Student Leadership Policy for 2024

Next term we will begin working with our current Year 5 students to fill several new student leadership roles for 2024. We will be selecting two School Captains and two Prefects. Their roles will include representing the school at official functions, preparing and presenting speeches for school assemblies as well as several other responsibilities which are outlined in the policy.

We also have six House Captains (two from each house) as well as a team of Kindergarten buddies from the 2024 Year 6 cohort and a team of Stage 3 Library Monitors (students who will be in Years 5 or 6 in 2024).

The following timeline outlines the process for the remainder of this year.

TERM 4 - Week 5 WEDNESDAY	Student speeches candidates give a 2 minutes maximum speech students in Years 2-5 vote in the hall using ballot papers teachers vote too (worth the same) students place '1' and '2' next to their preferred choices for School Captains votes are tallied to decide Captains and Prefects
Presentation Day TERM 4 - Week 10 THURSDAY	Leaders are announced in front of the school community and badges presented

Uniforms

There has been a rise in students not wearing the correct school uniform to school.

Wearing school uniform promotes a sense of belonging for students and creates a positive identity for the school community. School uniforms also contribute to the personal safety of students by allowing easier recognition of students inside the school and in the community.

Please assist your children to be in correct school uniform (including school hats/jumpers) every day. Uniforms can be purchased at <u>GTschool</u> or second hand via the P&C. If you need financial assistance in obtaining uniforms, please contact Ms Ross (office manager) who will assist you.

Before and after school arrangements

Before school, students are only permitted to play in areas that are monitored by teachers (whether their parent/carer is present or not), or by Helping Hands staff (if students are enrolled in Helping Hands). No students, unless enrolled and participating in before school tennis class, should be playing on the oval or multicourt before school.

From 8:30am, supervision for all students occurs in the courtyard in front of the school hall. From 8:45am, K-2 students move around, with a teacher to be supervised in the courtyard near the school office. After school, all students should be picked up at 3pm or enrolled in Helping Hands. The playground is not available for play in the afternoon unless students are booked into and supervised by our after school care provider.
