Student Safety

This is a reminder that school car parks are for staff use only. Parent vehicles must not enter school car parks to park, drop off, pick up or turn around. This is extremely important to ensure the safety of our students.

If you need to drive to school to drop off and pick up your children, there is a public car park on the corner of St Peters St and Campbell St, a kiss and drop area on St Peters St next to the school and parking on surrounding streets. Please ensure you follow the instructions on all parking signs, ensuring you do not park in the no stopping area (turning circle) at the end of St Peters St.

Reminder - Electronic Devices at school

At the start of each year, a number of our senior students begin to bring a phone or smart watch to school as they start to walk to and from school independently. Immediately on arrival to school, all students must hand in their electronic devices (whether they have a SIM card in them or not). Devices must not be used on school grounds. All electronic devices needed for learning are provided by the school. If your child needs a medical exemption (for example, they need a device to track blood sugar levels for diabetes) an exemption can be sought.

Reminder - School Uniforms

There has been a significant increase in students not wearing full school uniform. This includes the correct school navy bucket hat (caps and beanies are not school hats and do not provide adequate sun protection), white socks and black shoes. All students and their families have a variety of uniform combinations to choose from to ensure a comfortable uniform for activity and for every body shape. Students can choose to wear a navy skort, navy shorts, navy long pants or navy fleece track pants. Uniforms can be purchased at the uniform shop (new) or second hand (P&C). Financial assistance can be provided if families are unable to purchase uniform items by contacting the office manager (Mrs Ross) or the Principal (Mrs Salter).

Every Day Matters



When it comes to attending school, every day matters

If your child misses as little as 1 day per fortnight, they will miss 4 weeks of school per year, which adds up to over 1 year missed over their school life.







NAPLAN - Year 3 and 5 students

This term, your child will undertake <u>NAPLAN assessment</u>. NAPLAN provides schools with valuable information about your child's learning progress in literacy and numeracy. NAPLAN is only one way we assess student learning in years 3, 5, 7 and 9.

NAPLAN will take place from Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March in 2024. Students will not have an assessment every day, this is a window for exams to take place in.

Your child's teacher is getting students ready for NAPLAN and will provide appropriate support and guidance. Students will become familiar with the types of questions in the tests and the online testing platform that we use. In addition to school preparation, I want to share with you some information on how you can further support your child for NAPLAN.

Preparation for NAPLAN

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN and do not need excessive preparation or the use of services by coaching providers. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program. If you or your child/children would like to know more about the NAPLAN online platform you can go to the <u>public demonstration site</u> and do some practice tests and <u>past NAPLAN papers</u> are also available online.

Participation in NAPLAN

Adjustments are available for students who have diverse functional abilities and needs. On a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments for individual students can be made so they can complete NAPLAN. Speak to your child's teacher to discuss the adjustments available. 
Assessment tips

These along with arriving at school on time ready to sit the test will help prepare our students do their best on the day.




