## Nutrition Snippet

#### APPLE AND CINNAMON SLICE



Ingredients

⅓ cup caster sugar

1/2 cup reduced-fat natural Greek

1 tsp ground cinnamon 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour

#### Method

Step 1: Preheat the oven to 180°C. Grease and line a 20cm x 20cm square

Step 2; Add the apple purée and sugar to a large bowl and whisk until Step 3: Whisk in the eggs, one at a time until combined.

Step 4: Add the yoghurt and cinnamon and whisk to combine. Add the flour and

gently fold through until combined.

Step.5: Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin. Arrange the apple slices on top.

Bake for 20-25 minutes, until a skewer inserted in the center comes out clean. Step 6: Stand in tin for 10 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack to cool.





Hearing Australia will be visiting over 1000 locations across Australia in March offering free 15 minute hearing checks for adults. click the link for more:


